Middle East, health-care for refugees and migrants, and evaluated the need for foreign military bases in sovereign territories. Handpicked delegates from every committee were pitted against each other in an exciting Night Crisis where delegates representing the international community tried to manoeuvre through an extremely tense scenario caused by the discovery of oil in international waters. The Press Corps debated on the issue of censorship, and at the same time worked tirelessly to

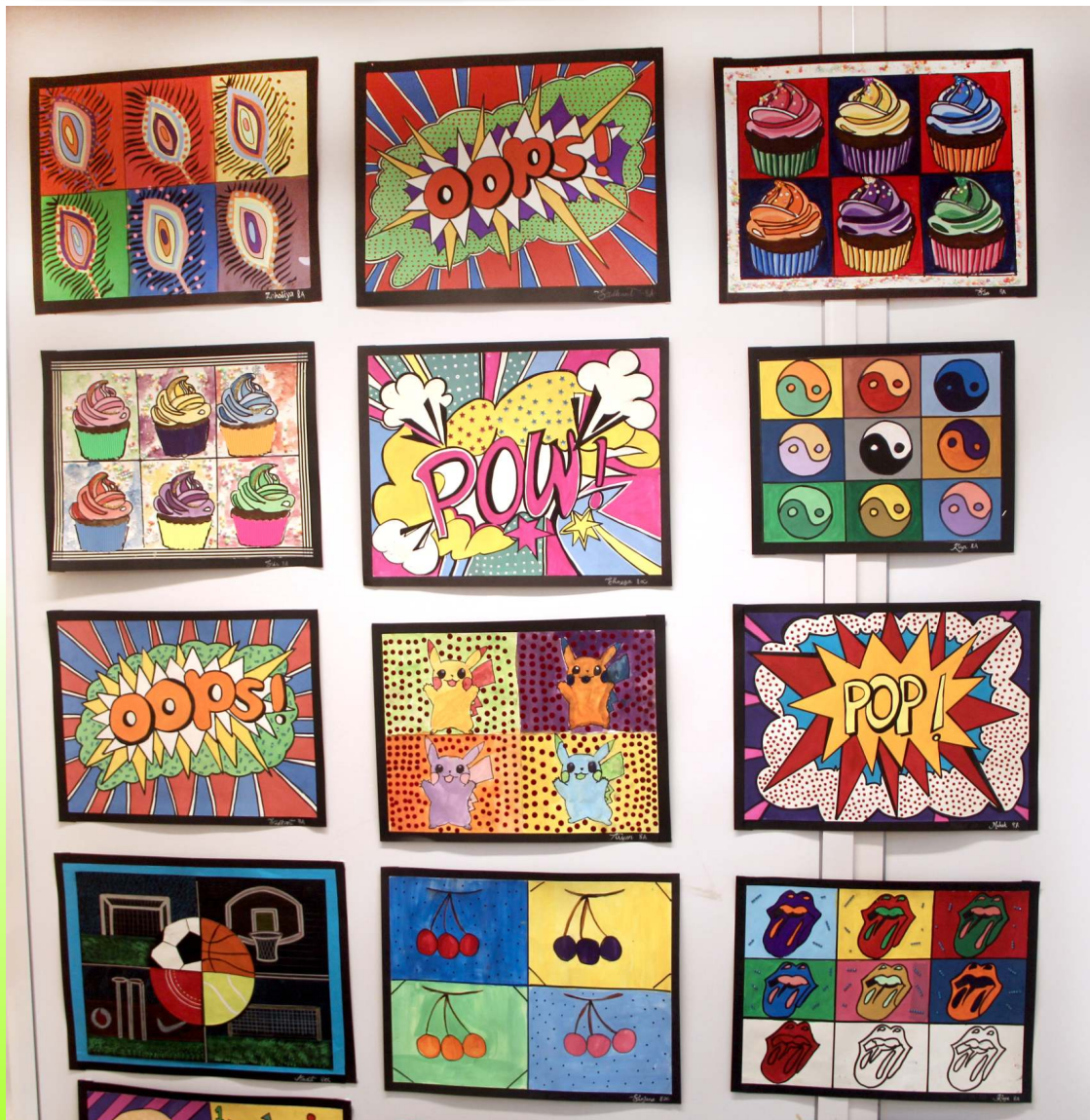


VISUAL ART EXHIBITION

The students of the V Care CAS Club had visited the Tata Memorial Hospital during the 2018 Diwali break, for the 'Share a Celebration' event where they distributed gift hampers to patients. During their interaction with the patients and their families, they realized that most patients come from outside Mumbai, are destitute, and are challenged to find affordable accommodation during the treatment phase. The students came up with the idea of raising funds so that the V Care organization could facilitate basic accommodation for these patients and their families.

In the process, they experienced the real meaning of Mudita, which comes from the Sanskrit word which means "unselfish joy".

Give us this day our daily bread... Roti Bank

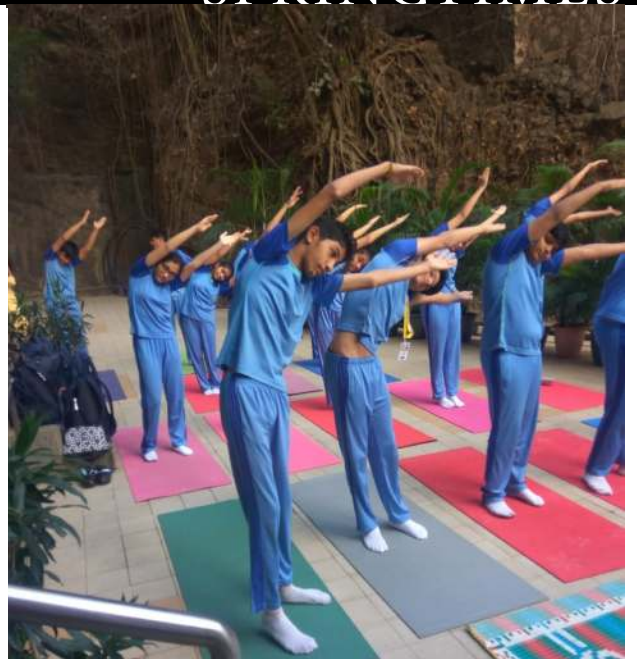

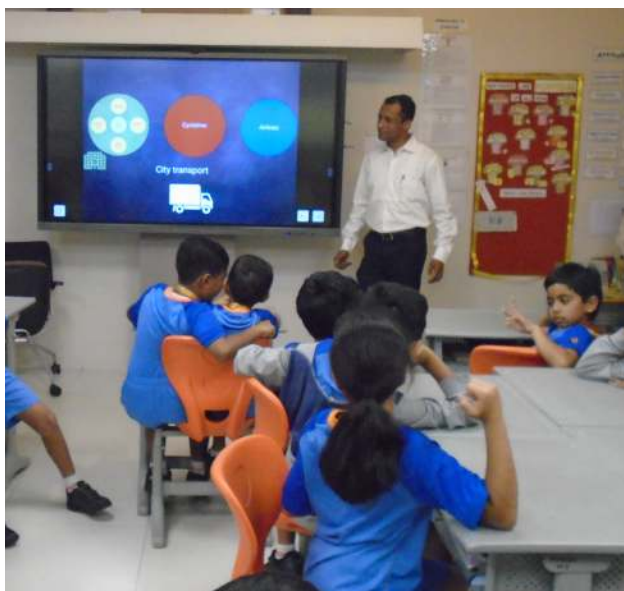
Field trip to Reliance Fresh

He took their understanding further by explaining how his department is dependent on systems within the organization as well as those outside the organization bringing out the local as well as global interdependence.

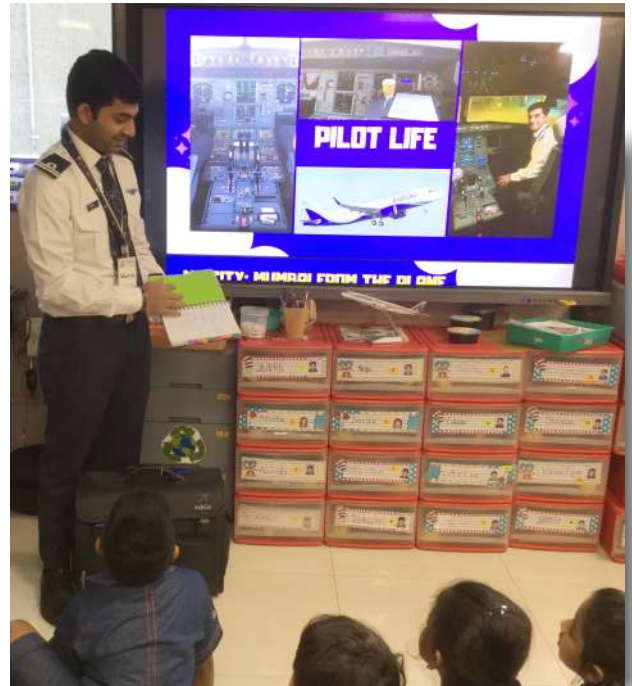
Grade 4
