D.S.O. Taekwondo Competition



Cyberbullying Awareness

On Friday, 26th October 2018, the Grade 7 learners, as part of their GP/CAS inquiry into 'How can social media be used to create awareness about cyberbullying?' had an informative session conducted by Ms. Sonali Patankar, founder of the NGO Responsible Netism, that works

along with the cyber cell police as well as the Ministry of Education.

Through an interactive presentation and various case studies, Ms. Sonali oriented the 7th graders about cyber awareness and wellness that focussed on responsible online behaviour.

Students were made aware of the perils of online games like Poker, Clash of Clans, PUBG etc. which involve money and befriending strangers.

Ms. Patankar also recounted several instances of cyber bullying along with its various stages i.e. fake profile, stalking, harassment, excluding, morphing, trolling and defaming. Students were informed that a cyber-predator can launch an attack within 4 minutes of analysing their victims' personality by tracking their online

footsteps displayed on social media. Hence, they were asked to refrain from venting out on social media.

The learners were very attentive and participated enthusiastically in the discussions.
They asked

relevant questions that showed their curiosity and thirst to explore this topic further.





GP unit on Sports & Recreation

Grade 8 are currently doing a GP unit on Sports and Recreation, with special focus on difficulties faced by disabled sports persons.

To sensitize the learners, they were taken to the football field and made to play the game as disabled persons, once without speaking, second time without using their hands and third time on their knees.

Learners shared their frustration at not being able to play properly and also developed empathy for those players who deal with these frustrations on a permanent basis.









Exploring Themes of Sustainability and Conservation across Ecosystems

The joint educational excursion to Goa (for Environmental Management, Biology and Global Perspectives) showed us a different part of Goa,

one that we did not even know existed. From the stay, which was in the middle of a spice farm (that also grew coffee, betel-nut, banana and other plants), to the mangroves and the entire mangrove ecosystem (that we were introduced to by three stalwarts from the

Mangrove Society of India), to the visit to the Netravali Sanctuary (where we learnt about the different plant life around, while also trekking to a waterfall and catching as well as identifying various insects in the river ecosystem), to interviewing fishermen and learning about sustainable fishing etc, to going on a night walk with a Forest Department official (in order to locate and identify nocturnal invertebrates), to

learning about and discussing citizen conservation, making compost and much more, it was an action-packed three and a half days!

It was a thoroughly planned and executed programme that was organized by Khoj-Aao! Adventures, and attended by 35 students, accompanied by the IGCSE Coordinator (Ms. Wilhelmina Athaide) the EM teacher (Ms. Tasneem Palgharwala) and the Bio teacher (Mr. Preetham D'silva).





BMC D Ward - Grade 5

A panel discussion was also arranged. The students showed great enthusiasm in their interaction.
